“Land sovereignty, reparations and liberation for ADOS and indigenous peoples.”


“BIPOC queer trans sanctuary.”

“Lack of training opportunities in my area, where I can continue to have a paying job and train in agroecology in my community.”

“Finding secure land tenure, sustaining community projects while not wanting to feed into capitalism.”

“Sustainable productive and consumptive modes.”

“Finding ways to fund our projects and make it economically sustainable.”

“Getting in my way is capitalism, the way our world and our minds have been structured. Capitalism fuels a fear that we will not survive if we do not work; ideally we will all ensure that our neighbors can proceed with us.”

“My biggest barrier is money & access land. The next barrier is simply learning all I can about growing food and building homes in a positive way.”

“Nothing stands in my way of getting it. I just have to remain patient. The barriers are the actual belief systems that cause doubt & fear.”



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"Working in a cooperative/ shared decision making structures."

"Traditional ways of growing food -- i.e. without supporting corporations or destruction of land."

"I want to learn ways for BIPOC land stewards to obtain and protect land. I want to gather my community in ways that will make capitalism and western ways of living obsolete."

"Learning how to build housing structures that are integrated into a living garden."

"Managing land without boundaries or being told what type of agriculture is "correct". Especially when the "correct" practice is industrial and prioritizes quantity over health of our land."
