





NATIONAL YOUNG FARMERS COALITION





For the National Young Farmers Coalition (Young Farmers), success means turning bold legislative change into material benefit for young and BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) farmers. We achieve this future by organizing farmers and advocating for policy solutions that meaningfully support them. At the grassroots level, we cultivate farmer leadership via advocacy fellowships, chapter network, and community organizing. In Washington, D.C., we back them up with strategic, creative policy campaigns that are reflective of and accountable to farmers' needs and lived experiences.



FARM BILL AND ADVOCACY

BOLD STRUCTURAL CHANGE IS CRITICAL TO ENSURE A JUST FUTURE FOR AGRICULTURE AND SUSTAINABLE FOOD SYSTEMS.


The next Farm Bill is being written right now. In 2023, we mobilized leaders across the country to ensure our demands for the future of farming are heard before the bill is finalized. Since launching our **One Million Acres for the Future campaign** in November 2021, the Young Farmers team has been working hard to build power for our farmer leaders and to change federal policy—and we have started to see this work bear fruit!

We led land and conservation-related marker bills that have garnered endorsements from hundreds of partnering organizations and growing bipartisan support in Congress as more representatives co-sponsor the bills:









INCREASING ACCESS TO CAPITAL AND LAND

As a result of our advocacy, the USDA launched the Increasing Land, Capital, and Market Access (LCM) program, which **distributed a landscape-changing \$300 million in funding** to support community-led, BIPOC-centered, cooperative land and capital projects.

WE SUPPORTED 19 BIPOC-LED ORGANIZATIONS IN APPLYING FOR THIS FUNDING, AND IN JUNE WE LEARNED 13 OF THEM WERE AWARDED FUNDING!

We are engaged in ongoing efforts to support funded organizations and to communicate with USDA about the implementation of this program.

Through the Young Farmer Grant Program, in partnership with Chipotle, we awarded 75 grants of \$5,000. The newest grant recipients have bold visions for building long-term resiliency through regenerative operations.



GRASSROOTS ORGANIZING AND BASE BUILDING

We hosted three **regional winter convergence events,** bringing together over 40 young farmer leaders to Atlanta, GA, San Luis Obispo, CA, and Washington, D.C. Fellows shared their experiences, learned key organizing and advocacy skills, and made their voices heard in a critical Farm Bill year. As part of the Convergence program, local farmers, community organizations, and Congressional offices joined press conferences, farm visits, and informal roundtable events to learn more about the LASO marker bill.

We launched a new **digital organizing platform** via Quorum to streamline text,
emails, and other actions, building political
power. 985 advocates have taken action in
one of our campaigns in 2023.
We cultivated our **chapter network** of 30
farmer-led chapters in 24 states. We are
proud to now resource 13 fiscally-sponsored
chapters, who secure and manage funding for
their own local projects and organizing.

Years ago, after losing a beloved community member, our Washington Chapter spearheaded a regional-level mental health campaign. Young Farmers then leveraged a mirroring national-level campaign. Together, these efforts resulted in funding and implementing the Farm and Ranch Stress Assistance Network (FRSAN) in the 2018 Farm Bill, a well-utilized program serving thousands of farmers.

In the Northeast, Young Farmers utilizes FRSAN funding to operate **Cultivemos**, a robust network of service providers and farmers united by a commitment to improve wellness and mental health for farmers and farmworkers.



In 2023, the Cultivemos network grew to 160 members representing 90 organizations in the Northeast


